



# Global Learn Day VI - Speakers and Timetable

## A 24 Hour Non-stop Interactive Webcast that Features Extraordinary People from 24 Time Zones.

### Introduction and Housekeeping

What time is Global Learn Day? What day is it?

The most frequent question we get is “what time is it for me?”

The official start time of GLD VI is 00:00 GMT, Sunday, October 13, 2002.

The official end time is 23:59 GMT, also Sunday, October 13, 2002.

**For those in the Americas:** GLD begins sometime in the afternoon, Saturday, October 12 - it ends 24 hours later, sometime Sunday afternoon, October 13

**For those in Europe, Africa and Asia:** GLD begins sometime Sunday October 13 and ends 24 hours later

The event “chases the sun.” We open in the South Pacific, where the planet begins the new day, and closes in the western Pacific, just east of the Date Line. Speakers appear Sunday afternoon around 14:00 local time.

So, if it is 2 p.m. Sunday, October 13 in New Delhi, that is when you will hear from Arun Mehta in India. And if it is 2 p.m in Moscow, that is also when you will hear from Boris Sedunov in Russia.

Don't be confused. Our Timetable will have hyperlinks to a World Time Clock. Link to it and a list will appear which "translates" the GMT times of our speakers to what time that is in several dozen cities elsewhere on the planet.

The full program begins at GMT 00:00 Sunday Oct. 13; you are invited to join us in the preview starting two hours earlier.

All times are expressed using a 24-hour clock.

Each region's presentations start on a new page in this printable program to help you select just what you need to follow along with the 24 hour event. The first timetable is one for the start of each geographic region; following timetables provide the details for each region. Each detail timetable includes a column in which you can record your local time.
